Sant Sebastia square, Barcelona (circa 1880) Around 30 NIMI members and friends welcomed Dr Pol Dalmau, history professor from Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona and his wife, Virginia, to New Italy Museum on Sunday 9 October. Dr Dalmau's shared his research from a variety of sources including Spanish, French and Filipino archives in a highly informative talk about the Italian families who settled New Italy from 1882. This adds another layer to the story of New Italy. Part of that story encompasses the time when hundreds of hopeful Italian emigrants assembled in Barcelona in this warehouse in Sant Sebastia Square, waiting to embark for an island paradise in the South Pacific. Both historians, Dr Dolmau and Dr Jo Kijas will work together on this new material. NIMI looks forward to a continuing relationship and the development of a new display for the New Italy Museum.

EREMONY FOR PTE JOHN CAMINITI | 18 OCTOBER



The Australian War Memorial (AWM) in Canberra stages a Last Post Ceremony each day at approx 4.45pm to honour one of the fallen who are listed on the Honour Roll at the AWM. On 18 October, Pte John Caminiti, 36th Inf. Bn. who was killed in action on 10 June 1917 was honoured in the Last Post Ceremony. John's grandchildren led by Mr Don Archer were in attendance and laid a wreath. John was one of the 13 young men who served

in the 1st AIF during WW1 and whose parents settled New Italy in 1882. Pte John Caminiti and Gnr Lorenzo Nardi were killed in action on the Western Front, another seven were wounded and two were decorated for gallantry. Their stories are on record at New Italy and their names are listed on an Honour Roll in the New Italy Museum.

Thirty-one people, including special guests, NSW Minister for the Arts, the Honourable Ben Franklin; Mayor of Richmond Valley Council, Robert Mustow plus the Member for Clarence Chris Gulaptis attended the announcement of our successful Creative Capital grant application. In the crowd were the sons of Floriano and Flavia Volpato, Nick and Luca Volpato with families. Floriano is well-remembered as the initiator of the Italian Pavilion in the early 1990s. He would have been very proud and thrilled by this event.

Much appreciation was given for volunteers' efforts and an on-going enthusiasm for this project plus other recent achievements. New Italy's survival after recent challenges was acknowledged and best wishes were offered for the future. ITALIAN PAVILION

To say that we are excited about our successful application is an understatement! Thank you Create NSW. However, as a very wise member of the Pavilion Reference Group said, "Now the real work begins!" An overview of the Pavilion project follows:



Stage 1 of the New Italy Italian Pavilion upgrade is the Pavilion's renovation. This has been estimated to cost \$400,000. The **Create NSW Creative Capital grant of \$250,000** will partially fund this. **NIMI is currently seeking donations and fundraising to fill the balance of \$150,000. All contributions are welcome!** The renovations will include the addition of 2 awnings (over the Piazza Entry and at the revised Pacific Highway Entry), external drainage, recladding the exterior and lining the ceiling, following the style of the recently upgraded New Italy Museum (2016-2019).

Stage 2 will be the design, fabrication and installation of the 3 strands of thematic displays within the Pavilion.

1. 'Migration Stories' forms a timeline down the spine of the building, depicting chain migration through the decades of the C20th starting near the Piazza Entry with the New Italy Sulky (connections from New Italy) and a Departure/Arrival wharf/cargo net and finishing at the Pacific Highway Entry with displays dedicated to Expo88 and the making of the New Italy Museum site and annual celebrations.

2. The Regions of Italy are based in the balustraded alcoves inherited from Expo88. The first to be refurbished will be Veneto. The arches and alcoves will be unaffected by the renovation.

3. Northern Rivers Italian Community displays – Faith, Brides, Businesses, Cafés, Salami making, the Clubs, and Events, Farming communities, Banana growing, Sugarcane cutting, Kitchen gardens, Kitchens, Wine/Grappa making, Olive growing, Grocery and Fruit shops. These are based in the archways inherited from Expo88. A large wall map encapsulating the spread of the NR Italian community will feature near the Piazza Entry. Chris Bertoldi and Terry Pirlo have supplied us with 13 plinths for these displays. Our first Pavilion meeting and working day in 2023 will be Monday 30 January: 10am - 3pm.
